<p>Research Activity</p> 	<p>Take on the role of a roving reporter and ask your family members (directly in the house or through phone/zoom interview) about their favourite poem. In your interview you can ask them:</p> <p>When did they learn about the poem (if they did)? When/How did they come across it? What memories does it evoke? Is it significant? Why?</p>
<p>Writing Activity</p>	<p>We're all going on lots of walks at the moment so why not do something creative with our experiences?</p> <p>Create a 'Walking memory.' Every minute or two /or 5mins, etc, make a note of what you see & build it up into a creative log of your walk. You can do it by taking a photo of one thing as you reach your agreed time and build it up through the walk (or write it as you go along, maybe recording it into your phones), then use it to build this into an organic piece of creative writing. You can decide on the structure (eg a new line for every 'moment'.)</p> <p>Look at Mrs Taylor Jones' example below:</p>

	<p>Single leaf, broken and brown, sitting sadly at the side of the road.</p> <p>Grubby garage door which was never repainted; ashamed & dejected.</p> <p>Next door's ancient tabby cat, with the ugly scar over its one ear.</p> <p>Rough red bricks, carrying a spider's home.</p> <p>My bike, thrown on the floor where my sister left it.</p>
<p>Artistic Activity</p> 	<p>Instead of creating a piece of writing from your 'walking memory' create your own piece of art instead. This might be an illustration or a photo gallery. Every minute or two /or 5mins, etc, make a note of what you see & build it up into images. You can do it by taking a photo of one thing as you reach your agreed time and build it up through the walk.</p>
